HOW ACQUIRED: Acquired along with Taurean Prince from the Brooklyn Nets as part of a three-team on January 14, 2021
2021-22: Appeared in 56 games (all starts) with Cleveland....veraged 16.1 points on . 677 shooting from the field, 10.8 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 1.34 blocks and 0.79 steals in 32.3 minutes...his averages in points (16.1), field goal percentage (.677), rebounds (10.8), steals (0.79) and total double-doubles (32) were all career-highs....named a 2022 NBA-All Star, his first career selection; finished with 10 points ( $5-6 \mathrm{FG}$ ), nine rebounds and two blocks in 24 minutes in the All-Star Game in Cleveland...scored in double figures on 50 occasions, including $20+$ points 16 times...grabbed $10+$ rebounds 33 times this season and $20+$ rebounds once... tallied 11 games with $20+$ points and $10+$ rebounds...recorded 10 games with $15+$ points and $15+$ rebounds, including four consecutive games from Nov. 1-7; became the second player for the Cavs in the last 25 seasons to record four consecutive games with 15+ points and 15+ rebounds (Anderson Varejao, 5 from Nov. 26-Dec. 3, 2012)...recorded a career-high 29 points on 12-20 (.600) shooting from the field, a season-high 22 rebounds (career-high 11 offensive rebounds) and two assists in 34 minutes on Feb. 4 at Charlotte; was his 3rd career game with 20+ points and $20+$ rebounds; became the 12th different player in Cavs history to have $20+$ PTS and $20+$ REB in a game and his 11 offensive rebounds were one shy of tying the Cavs single game record (Tristan Thompson has 12 OREB 0ct. 31, 2014)...blocked a season-high five shots on Dec. 1 at MIA, the 8 th time in his career with $5+$ blocks...recorded a career-high tying three steals on three occasions this season (3 STL on Jan. 5 vs UTA, 3 STL on Oct. 20 at MEM and 3 STL on Feb. 26 vs. WAS)...tallied his 100th career double-double on Dec. 11 vs. Sacramento ( 19 PTS, 11 REB)...was named Eastern Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 7 , leading the Cavs to a 4.0 record; averaged 20.5 points on . 633 shooting from the field, an NBA-best 16.3 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.3 blocks in 37.0 minutes per contest over his four games that week...from Feb. 4-11, recorded 14+ rebounds in four-striaght games, his longest streak of $14+$ rebounds in his career, tallied 67 rebounds over that span...through the first four games of the season, shot $31-37$ (.838), becoming the first NBA player in the shot clock era (1954-55) to start the first four games of a season shooting $.800+$ on $30+$ made shots...shot a perfect $11-11$ from the field with 25 points, 4 rebounds, three steals and three blocks in 29 minutes on $0 c t$. 20 at Memphiss, became the first player in the shot clock era (since 1954) to go 10 -for-10 or better from the floor in their team's season-opening game...missed the final 18 games of the regular season due to a left middle finger fracture.
PROFESSIONAL CAREER: Has appeared in 341 career regular season games ( 276 starts) over five seasons with Brooklyn and Cleveland....owns career averages of 11.6 points, 8.7 rebounds and 1.36 blocks in 26.6 minutes per game...also shooting .626 from the field...has 115 career double-doubles...has 142 games with at least 10 rebounds and three $20+$ rebound performances...only 5 times in Cavaliers history has a player recorded $25+$ PTS, $10+$ REB, $3+$ BLK and $.800+\mathrm{FG} \%$ and Allen has done it 3 times ( $2 / 21 / 21$ vs. OKC, $2 / 24 / 21$ vs. HOU and $4 / 25 / 21$ at WAS); the other two occasions were done by Jim Chones ( $12 / 29 / 74$ vs. ATL) and Elmore Smith ( $3 / 13 / 77$ at ATL).

2020-21: Played in 63 games (45 starts) for Brooklyn and Cleveland....overaged career highs in PPG (12.8), RPG (10.0), APG (1.7) and MPG (29.6)...averaged a double-double in a single season for the first time of his career....was 1 of only 3 players in the NBA with at least 10.0 PPG, $10.0 \mathrm{RPG}, 1.0 \mathrm{BPG}$ and a $.600 \mathrm{FG} \%$ (Rudy Gobert, Deandre Ayton)...ranked 5th in the NBA in FG\% (.618), 9th in blocks (1.43), 13th in rebounds (10.0) and tied for 19th in double-doubles (25)...scored in double figures 42 times, including six games of 20+ points... in 51 games ( 40 starts) for Cleveland, overaged 13.2 points, 9.9 rebounds and 1.39 blocks in 30.3 minutes...had at least 1 block in 41 of his 51 appearances with the Cavs, induding 17 multi-block games..in a win over Minnesota on Feb. 1, became the 1st player in Cavaliers history to post 23 PTS, 18 REB \& 5 BLK in a single game and the 1st NBA player with that stat line with a FG\% of .778 or greater since 2012 (Javale McGee, 23 PTS, 18 REB, 5 BLK, $.846 \mathrm{FG} \%$ on $1 / 14 / 12$ vs. PHI)....gainst Denver on Feb. 19 , became the lst Cavalier with $20+$ PTS, $10+$ REB and a $.889 \mathrm{FG} \%$ in over 7 years (Tristan Thompson, 2014); also made his 1,000 th career field goal with his 7 th make against Denver...versus Oklahoma City on Feb. 21 (career-high 26 PTS, 17 REB, $11-11$ FG), became the 1st player in Cavs history and 8th NBA player EVER to tally $25+$ PTS and $15+$ REB while shooting $100 \%$ from the field (Mitch Kupchak $11 / 20 / 81$, Dwight Howard $2 / 24 / 10$, Wes Unseld $1 / 31 / 75$, Dikembe Mutombo $12 / 14 / 99$, Wilt Chamberloin 7 times, Calvin Natt $3 / 18 / 82$ and Walt Bellamy $1 / 23 / 64$ ); also was iust the 2 nd Cavalier ever to shoot $11-11$ of better from the field in a single game (Johnny Warren, $12-12$ FG on $12 / 14 / 73$ vs. BUF)...also grabbed his 2,000 th career rebound with his 7 th b board against Oklahoma City on Feb. 21...in a win over Houston on Feb. 24 ( 26 PTS, 18 REB, 4 BLK, $10-11 \mathrm{FG}$ ), became just the 2 nd NBA player in the Shot Clock Era to record $26+$ PTS, $18+$ REB and 4+ BLK while shooting $.900+$ from the field, joining Dikembe Mutombo on $12 / 14 / 1999$ ( 27 PTS, 29 REB, 6 BLK, $11-11$ FG)...from Feb. 23-24, became the 1 1t Cavalier with $4+$ blocks in back-to-back games since Zydrunas Ilgauskas in February 2008 (2/2/08-2/5/08)...notched 6 straight double-doubles from Feb. $14-24$, the longest of his NBA career...ot Washington on April 25, posted a career-high 27 PTS ( $10-12$ FG, 7.9 FT ), a game-high 12 REB and 3 BLK in 34 MIN...scored his 3,000th career point with his sixth point against Indiana on May 10 ...missed 8 games due to a concussion from March 27 -April 11 .
2019-20: Appeared in 70 games ( 64 starts) for Brooklyn....veraged 11.1 points, 9.6 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.3 blocks in 26.5 minutes per game while shooting .649 from the field and .633 from the free-throw line...led the Nets in bpg (1.3) and double-doubles (30)...finished third in the league in FG (.649) and 10th in offensive rebounds per game (3.1)...set single-season career highs in mpg , ppg , $\mathrm{FG} \%$, rpg, apg, double-doubles and offensive rating (110.6), while increasing his marks in those categories for the third strright season...recorded more double-doubles this season (30) than in his first two seasons combined (28)...established a Nets single-season record for dunks (177) - with data going back to 1997-98... Posted the highest single season FG \% in franchise history, and became the first Net to finish in the top-three in the league in $\mathrm{FG} \%$ since Mikki Moore led the league in the category (.609) in the 2006-07 season...converted 177 dunks in the 2019-20 season, which marked the most dunks in a season for a Net since the first season that dunk data was available (1997-98)... missed one gome due to injury (injury management - left ankle sprain) and one game due to rest.
2018-19: Appeared in and started 80 games for the Nets...averaged 10.9 points, 8.4 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.4 assists in 26.2 minutes per game...shot 590 from the field and .709 from the charity stripe...led or tied for the team lead in points once, rebounds 33 times, assists once, steals 14 times, blocks 51 times and minutes played three times...increased his points per game, rebounds per game, offensive rebounds per game, blocks per game and minutes per game from his rookie season to his sophomore season...scored in double figures 51 times, including three games of $20+$ points...was named a MTN DEW ICE Rising Star, participating in the Rising Stars game for Team USA during All-Star weekend in Charlotte...ronked 12th in the league in blocks per game and eighth in the league in field goal percentage...finished first among second-year players in blocks per game, second in offensive rebounds per outing (2.4) and field gool percentage, third in double-doubles (24) and fourth in rebounds per game...led the Nets in double-doubles (24), after posting four double-doubles as a rookie, which marked the biggest increase from a first to second season in double-doubles for a Net in franchise history (previously: Kenny Anderson didn't record a double-double as a rookie in 1991-92, then notched 17 in his second season in 1992-93)...converted 170 dunks, finishing seventh in the league, second in the East (trailing only Giannis Antetkounmpo) and matching the most dunks by a Net since the stat was first tracked in the 1997-98 season (Kenyon Martin in 2002-03)...finished the season first in blocks per game among players 20 or younger, second in rebounds per contest and third in double-doubles...through two seasons, is shooting the second-highest field gool perentage in Nets history (.590), triiling only Darryl Dawkins' 601 field goal percentage...became the 13 th player in NBA history to register 200 career blocks prior to turning 21 1... Became just the eighth player in NBA history to average $10.5+$ points, $8.4+$ rebounds and $1.5+$ blocks per game in a full season prior to turning 21, joining Shaquille 0 'Neal (1992-93), Chris Webber (1993-94), Joe Smith (1995-96), Elton Brand (1999-00), Dwight Howard (2004-05), Andre Drummond (2013-14), Anthony Davis (2013-14) and Kar-Anthony Towns (2015-16)..finished the season fourth in the league in screen assists per game with 4.7 (he totaled 2.2 /game as a rookie)...played his best game of the season in an overtime victory in Houston on $1 / 16$, posting 20 points and a career-high 24 rebounds (his first-career 20/20 game) in a career-high 43 minutes, joining Andre Drummond, Dwight Howard, Shaquille 0 'Neal and John Drew as players to register $20+$ points and $24+$ boards in a game prior to turning 21 ...scored a season-high 24 points with 11 rebounds on $11 / 17$ against the L.A. Clippers....nothed double digit rebounds 32 times ofter doing so just five times as a rookie...totaled 35 games with multiple blocks, induding eight games with four or more blocks (career-high six blocks in a triple overtime win in Cleveland on $2 / 13$ )...missed two games due to illness.

2017-18: Appeared in 72 games ( 31 starts) in his rookie season...averaged 8.2 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.2 blocks in 20.0 minutes per game...shot . 589 (234-0f-397 FG), 333 ( 5 -of-15 3FG) and .776 ( $114-0 \mathrm{of}-147 \mathrm{FT}$ )...led or tied for the team lead in points twice, rebounds 11 times, steals seven times and blocks a team-high 33 times...made his NBA debut in the second game of the season on $10 / 20$ vs. Orlando, becoming the third teenager and second-youngest player to don a Nets uniform at 19 years, 182 days, trailing only Derrick Favors ( 19 years, 104 days)...finished first among rookies in FG percentage and blocks per game, second in offensive rebounds per game and seventh in rebounds per game and FT percentage... led all qualifying rookies in True Shooting percentage and Effective Field Goal percentage...finished 17th in the league in blocks per game...became the fourth rookie in Nets history to lead all rookies in blocks per contest, joining Brook Lopez (2008-09), Sean Williams (2007-08) and Kenyon Martin (2000-01)...blocked at least one shot in 14 straight games to wrap up the season, which marked the third-longest streak for a Nets rookie since 1983-84, trailing only P.J. Brown's 16-game streak (1993-94) and Brook Lopez's 15-game streak (2008-09); in that 14 -game stretch, he registered multiple blocks 10 times and averaged 2.6 blocks, which was the second-highest tally among all players in the league in that time frame, trailing only Anthony Davis (3.1 blocks per game)....swatted four or more shots in three straight games ( $4 / 5-4 / 9$ ), becoming just the second Nets rookie since 1983-84 to achieve that feat (Kenyon Martin in the 2000-01 season)...the only rookies to block four or more shots in three straight games in the last 20 years are Allen, Yao Ming (2002-03), Martin (2000-01), Lamar Odom (1999-00) and Tim Duncan (1997-98)...led all rookies with 23 multi-block games... his 88 blocks were the most in a season for a teenager since the 2012-13 campaign, when Anthony Davis blocked 112 shots and Andre Drummond rejected 95 shots...converted a team-high 117 dunks, which marked the 14th-most in the league and were the most in a season for a Net since Brook Lopez's 126 dunks in the 2009-10 season...started the last 31 games he appeared in (from 1/30 - end of the season), averaging 10.5 points (. $621 \mathrm{FG}, .805 \mathrm{FT}$ ), 6.4 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.7 blocks in 23.8 minutes per game....among players with 200 -plus FGA in 2018 , Allen's .637 FG percentage finished fourth in the league...was the first player in franchise history to shoot . 550 -plus from the field and .750 -plus from the FT line in a full season...became the third rookie in NBA history to reach those percentages in a season (min. 300 FGA and 100 FTA), joining Jonas Valanciunas (2012-13) and Jeff Ruland (1981-82)...posted the second-highest FG percentage among teens in NBA history (min. 300 FGA), trailing only Andre Drummod's .608 as a 19 -year-old in 2012-13...averaged 9.7 points (. 637 FG ), 6.0 rebounds and 1.4 blocks in 21.8 minutes per game in 2018, up from 5.6 points (. 484 FG), 4.3 rebounds and 1.0 blocks in 17.0 minutes per game prior to the New Year...recorded four double-doubles and became the first Nets rookie center since $1983-84$ to register a $10 / 5 / 5$ game when he totaled 13 points and career highs for rebounds (14) and assists (six) on $2 / 7$ at Detroit...reached double figures 28 times, including a career-high 20 points on $2 / 2$ vs. LA Lakers... Became the first Nets rookie since Brook Lopez (2008-09) to post a five-block game when he registered a career-high five blocks on $4 / 5$ at Milwaukee...missed seven games due to injury (six - left foot strain and one - sore left foot)...was a DNP - cooch's decision three times...was inactive five times.

PLAYOFF CAREER: In two postseason appearances with Brooklyn, has career playoff averages of 10.7 points, 10.3 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.1 blocks in 26.9 minutes per contest in nine playoff games (all starts)...has shot .589 from the field and .833 from the free-throw line...during the $\mathbf{2 0 2 0}$ Playoffs, appeared in four playoff games (all starts) against Toronto in the First Round, averaging 10.3 points, 14.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.8 blocks in 33.1 minutes per game...in the $\mathbf{2 0 1 9}$ Playoffs, played in five games (all starts) against Philadelphia in the First Round....averaged 11.0 points on .594 shooting, 6.8 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 22.0 minutes per game...scored a playoff career-high 21 points, including shooting 7 -of-7 from the free-throw line, to go with eight rebounds, four assists and two steals in 32 minutes in Game 4 on $4 / 20$...also scored in double figures in Game 3 on $4 / 18$, posting 15 points, six rebounds and two assists in 21 minutes.

COLLEGE CAREER: Played one season at the University of Texas at Austin in 2016-17...appeared in and started all 33 games for the Longhorns, averaging 13.4 points, 8.4 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in 32.1 minutes per game...named to the All-Big 12 Conference Third Team and Big 12 All-Newcomer Team...claimed a spot on the 10 -person USBWA All-District VII Team and five-person NABC All-District 8 Second Team...led the team in rebounding ( 8.4 rpg ), blocked shots ( 51 ) and minutes played ( 32.1 mpg ) and ranked second on the team in scoring ( 13.4 ppg )...shot .566 ( $179-0-316$ ) from the field...reached double figures in scoring 25 times and double figures in rebounds 14 times...recorded 12 double-doubles on the season (tied for the third-highest total by a UT freshman in school history), including eight in Big 12 Conference play...in Big 12 Conference play ( 18 games), he averaged a team-best 16.2 points and 9.8 rebounds per game while shooting .599 (118-0f-197) from the field...recorded a double-double with 16 points on $7-0 f-11$ shooting from the field and 12 rebounds along with two blocks in 36 minutes during his collegiate debut against Incarnate Word on $11 / 11 \ldots$...posted 14 points ( $6-0 f-8 \mathrm{FG}$ ) and 13 rebounds in 35 minutes at Kansas State on $12 / 30 \ldots$ earned Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Co-Newcomer of the Week honors on $1 / 16$ after averaging 18.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game during UT's two contests against No. 10 West Virginia and TCU...recorded 17 points and 10 rebounds while tying his career-high with three blocks in 31 minutes at №. 6 Baylor on 1/17...totaled a career-high 22 points and a career-high 19 rebounds (seven offensive) while tying his career-high with three blocks in 34 minutes at No. 2 Kansas on $1 / 21$...his 19 rebounds marked the second-highest single-game total by a UT freshman in school history (Kevin Durant had 23 boards at Texas Tech on $1 / 31 / 07$ )...claimed Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Newcomer of the Week honors on $1 / 23$ after averaging 19.5 points, 14.5 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game against a pair of Top 10 opponents on the road, №. 6 Baylor and №. 2 Kansas...tied his career-high with 22 points and added nine rebounds, a career-high three steals, two blocks and two assists in 36 minutes at TCU on $2 / 4$...posted a game-high 17 points and nine rebounds in 34 minutes against lowa State on $2 / 7$... hit two free throws with 7.2 seconds remaining (facing a 1 -and-1 situation) that proved to be the game-winning points against lowa State on $2 / 7$...posted 17 points, seven rebounds and two blocks while tying his career high in minutes played (37) at No. 12 West Virginia on $2 / 20$... Recorded 20 points and 11 boards (five offensive) in 35 minutes against No. 3 Kansas on 2/25...tallied a game-high 20 points, along with nine rebounds and three blocks, in 36 minutes against No. 11 Baylor on $3 / 4$...earned a spot on the Fall 2016 Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll (minimum 3.0 GPA).

PERSONAL: Is the son of Leonard and Cheryl Allen...has one older brother, Leonard II...father, Leonard, played basketball at San Diego State (1982-85); he was selected by the Dallas Mavericks in the third round of the 1985 NBA Draft (50th overall pick) and played professional basketball in Europe...won a gold medal with the USA U18 National Team at the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in July 2016 in Valdivia, Chile...led Team USA and ranked fourth in the tournament overall in rebounding ( 9.0 rpg ) and topped the squad in minutes played $(23.8 \mathrm{mpg})$...ranked third on the team in scoring ( 10.6 ppg )...attended high school at St. Stephen's Episcopal School in Austin, Texas and played basketball under head coach Lamont King... ranked as the $N$ N. 15 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, Rivals.com and Scout.com following his senior season...named a McDonald's All-American...ranked as the No. 1 center in the country by ESPN...averaged 19.7 points and 13.3 rebounds per game as a senior while leading St. Stephen's to a $25-5$ record and the Southwest Preparatory Conference title...scored 33 points in a $66-57$ win against Bellaire Episcopal in the SPC championship game...is interested in computers.
