IT'S AN EXCITING TIME TO BE A MAGIC FAN - YEAR IN REVIEW

(Ownership DeVos Family; CEO Alex Martins; President of Basketball Operations Jeff Weltman; Head Coach Jamahl Mosley)

Basketball: Improved by 12 wins this past season, the largest improvement in the Eastern Conference...Roster features young core, including 2023 Rookie of the Year Paolo Banchero, 2022 All-Rookie First Teamer Franz Wagner, Markelle Fultz, Wendell Carter Jr., Cole Anthony and Jalen Suggs...Entering this year's NBA Draft, Orlando was in control of nine first round draft picks over the next seven drafts (one of just seven teams to control 81 first round picks over next seven drafts) and 12 future second round selections – all valuable assets...Opened the new state-of-the-art AdventHealth Training Center in August of 2022 (check it out here: <https://protect-us.mimecast.com/s/FNt8CYEIZphDzwM3s0Ryqz?domain=vimeo.com>)

ESPN.COM...Orlando Magic State of the roster: "No Eastern Conference lottery team is set up better for the future than Orlando. The Magic improved their win total from 22 to 34 and have the roster resources to take another jump starting with the draft. For a second time in three years, Orlando has two lottery picks (the Bulls retain their first if it jumps into the top four) and have a 9% chance of selecting first. The NBA's second-youngest roster – led by likely Rookie of the Year winner [Paolo Banchero](#), [Franz Wagner](#) and [Wendell Carter Jr.](#) -- has a sustainable foundation in place. Banchero averaged 20.0 points this season, the most by a rookie since Luka Doncic in 2018-19. He and Wagner are the third pair of teammates 21 or younger to average 18 points in a season. Carter averaged a career high 15.2 points and posted his fourth straight season of at least 8 rebounds per game. The Magic also have roster flexibility with 14 players under contract but only seven on guaranteed deals."

Attendance: No. 1 in the NBA in group ticket sales (now for eight straight years)...NBA Season Ticket Renewal award recipient in 2022-23...Among the leaders in the NBA in single-game ticket and new full season ticket sales...Hosted four of the top five crowds in franchise history this past season...The Magic have made a commitment to affordable ticket options, including its FastBreak Pass (e.g. \$49 monthly pass for 5 games).

The Orlando Wine Festival & Auction serves as signature fundraiser for OMYF...Via the DeVos Family Foundation donated more than \$2 million to the community this past year (continuation of 30 for 30 grants to celebrate 30 years of ownership and Hurricane relief).

ABOUT THE ORLANDO MAGIC

Orlando's NBA franchise since 1989, the Magic's mission is to be world champions on and off the court, delivering legendary moments every step of the way. Under the DeVos family's ownership, the Magic have seen great success in a relatively short history, winning six division championships (1995, 1996, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2019) with seven 50-plus win seasons and capturing the Eastern Conference title in 1995 and 2009. Off the court, on an annual basis, the Orlando Magic gives more than \$2 million to the local community by way of sponsorships of events, donated tickets, autographed merchandise and grants. Orlando Magic community relations programs impact an estimated 100,000 kids each year, while a Magic staff-wide initiative provides more than 7,000 volunteer hours annually. In addition, the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation (OMYF) which serves at-risk youth, has distributed more than \$28 million to local nonprofit community organizations over the last 33 years. The Magic's other entities include the team's NBA G League affiliate, the Osceola Magic, 2021 G League champions; the Orlando Solar Bears of the ECHL, which serves as the affiliate to the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning; and Magic Gaming of the NBA 2K League. The Magic play their home games at the award-winning Amway Center, honored with TheStadiumBusiness Awards' 2013 Customer Experience Award and named *SportsBusiness Journal's* 2012 Sports Facility of the Year. JEFF WELTMAN

President of Basketball Operations

Jeff Weltman, who brings more than 32 years of experience in basketball operations in the NBA, was named president of basketball operations of the Orlando Magic on May 23, 2017. He is responsible for overseeing all aspects of the team's basketball operations department.

Since joining Orlando, the Magic advanced to postseason play in back-to-back seasons in 2018-19 and 2019-20 for the first time in eight years (since 2010-11 and 2011-12). During his second season in Orlando (2018-19), the Magic clinched a berth into the NBA Playoffs for the first time since 2012 and captured the Southeast Division title, their first since 2009-10.

Orlando selected Paolo Banchero with the first overall pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. He went on to capture the 2022-23 NBA Rookie of the Year, becoming the third player in franchise history to ever win the award. Franz Wagner, the eighth overall pick of the 2021 NBA Draft, was named to the 2021-22 NBA All-Rookie First Team.

Weltman came to Orlando after four seasons with the Toronto Raptors, including his final season as general manager (2016-17). He joined the Raptors as executive vice president, basketball operations in 2013.

Prior to joining Toronto, Weltman spent five seasons as assistant general manager of the Milwaukee Bucks from 2008-13. During his tenure with Milwaukee, he assisted in all basketball, salary cap and administrative matters.

Weltman came to Milwaukee following one year as director of basketball administration in Detroit (2007-08) and five seasons as assistant general manager with the Denver Nuggets (2001-06).

During his time in Denver, Weltman helped engineer personnel moves that shifted the Nuggets from a struggling team with no salary cap flexibility to one of the up-and-coming teams in the NBA. The Nuggets won 49 games in 2004-05, the fourth-most since the franchise joined the NBA in 1976. In 2003-04, the Nuggets posted the sixth-biggest turnaround in NBA history, improving their win total by 26 games and reached the playoffs for the first time since 1995.

Weltman joined the Nuggets after spending 13 seasons with the Los Angeles Clippers, where he served as director of player personnel since 1994.

The New York native originally joined the Clippers as video coordinator in 1988 and was immediately elevated to a scouting position. During his last season in Los Angeles (2000-01), the Clippers improved their win total by 16 – the biggest turnaround in the league.

Weltman graduated in 1987 from Oberlin College in Ohio, where he earned two varsity letters in basketball. He and his wife, Alexis, have twin daughters, Lucy and JJ.



JAMAHL MOSLEY

Head Coach

Jamahl Mosley became the 15th head coach in Orlando Magic history on July 11, 2021.

Mosley has compiled a career NBA regular season record of 56-108 (.341). During the 2022-23 campaign, he led the Magic to a 34-48 record, which was a 12-game improvement from the previous season - the best improvement in the Eastern Conference and third-best in the NBA. During his first season at the helm (2021-22), Orlando finished 22-60 (.268). Mosley made his NBA head coaching debut on Oct. 20, 2021 @ San Antonio and recorded his first NBA head coaching win on Oct. 24, 2021 @ New York.

Mosley came to Orlando after spending the previous seven seasons (2014-21) as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks. While on the coaching staff, the Mavericks reached the NBA Playoffs four times. He has also served as the head coach on the Mavericks summer league team that competed in Las Vegas.

Prior to joining the Mavericks, Mosley spent four seasons (2010-14) as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers. Before joining the Cavaliers, Mosley spent five seasons (2005-10) with the Denver Nuggets. His tenure began in player development and advance scouting, before becoming an assistant coach for his last three seasons (2007-10) with the franchise. The Nuggets reached the playoffs, winning 50 games or more, each of his final three years. They won the Northwest division twice and earned a trip to the Western Conference Finals in 2009.

Mosley was a four-year letterman at the University of Colorado (1997-2001), where he is one of 33 players in school history to score more than 1,000 points. Following his collegiate career, he played four seasons of professional basketball overseas, including two years for the Victoria Titans (Australia), one year with Baloncesto Leon (Spain) and one year in Korea.

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Mosley was named an assistant coach for the 2021 USA Select Team and served as an assistant coach at the 2018 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp. He has also participated in Basketball Without Borders in Africa on several occasions.

He and his wife, Kristina, have three children, Jemma, C.J. and Chance.

DYLAN MURPHY

Summer League Head Coach

Dylan Murphy will serve as head coach of the Orlando Magic during NBA2K24 Summer League 2023 in Las Vegas.

Murphy was named head coach of the Osceola Magic, Orlando's NBA G League affiliate, on June 28, 2023. He has spent the last five seasons with the Orlando Magic, including three seasons as an assistant coach (2020-23). From 2018-20, he served as basketball operations analyst, providing analytics support to the coaching staff.

Murphy joined Orlando after serving as a graduate assistant with the men's basketball team at Ball State University in 2018. Before his time with Ball State, he spent one season (2016-17) as an NBA G League scout for the Atlanta Hawks. In that role, he was responsible for identifying potential call-up candidates for the Hawks NBA roster.

Prior to Atlanta, Murphy spent three seasons (2013-16) as assistant coach of the Fort Wayne Mad Ants of the NBA G League. In 2013-14, the Mad Ants won the NBA G League championship, posting a league-best record of 34-16 during the regular season and going a perfect 6-0 during their playoff run. In the following season (2014-15), the Mad Ants earned a second-straight trip to the G League Finals.

Murphy earned a bachelor's degree in classics from Columbia University in 2012. He is married to his wife, Sarah.
